A MESSAGE FROM DEACON MIKE

What do you seek?



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Our Lady of the Prairie,

Our journey through life is just that...a journey. What is it that you and I seek? To what do we turn when things are not going so well? Who do we praise when things are going great? Are we humble enough to recognize that God is in control? Or, do we believe that our achievements are our own?

The Psalmist writes; "Blessed are they who observe his decrees, who seek him with all their heart." Are we seeking him? Are we praying outside of the church walls? Here's what's happening in the classrooms . . .

Mrs. Olson (Teacher Ashley) Preschool

We are learning about ourselves and how God created us all different. What are some things we like about each other? "I Like Me" written by Nancy Carlson is a great book that shares what it means to like yourself for who you are. One of our favorite activities was creating our GIANT self portraits! Have your child draw a picture of themselves at home.



Miss Schroers Kindergarten & 1st Grade

These past few weeks we have been learning about some new saints in our class. Saint Therese and Saint Cecilia, and now our February saints are Saint John Paul II and Saint Valentine. We will be learning about these saints' lives and how we can be more like them. In Catechesis, we learned the parable of the mustard seed and the parable of the precious pearl. The students really enjoy working with and pondering these stories during our time together for Catechesis. Our religion lessons are focusing on how our families and friends can help us learn and grow closer to God and that they are gifts from God!

In kindergarten math we are focusing on breaking apart numbers and adding to ten. For the first graders, we are working on larger addition sums and problem-solving strategies. Both grades are working on more sight words in reading. It has been so fun to see them discover these new words in books we read together, or they find in our classroom library! I can see lots of learning growth in the students!

Mrs. Hennen 2nd & 3rd Grades

Hello Families, It's been nice to have a regular schedule in our room! In our Religion class we are reviewing the Sacrament of Penance. We have been saying the Act of Contrition every day hoping to have it memorized by the end of the month. Next week we discuss prayers for Healing and Eternal Life.

Our next chapter in Social Studies is Our Country's History. In Science we are learning Animal inherited physical and behavioral traits.

On Monday second graders start working on subtracting three-digit numbers! Third graders are finishing up with units of measure and will have a short lesson on writing equations and a little algebra too! Next up is learning to collect and read Data.

With our Believe and Read program we will start oral fluency checks weekly and some small group work. This week is review and next week some assessments.



Mr. Lopahs 4th, 5th & 6th Grades

Our 4th, 5th, and 6th graders are back at work after all the fun times of Catholic Schools Week. For Social Studies we are completing our Unit on North America by exploring Mexico and Central America. It has been helpful that a classmate recently returned from vacation there and has shared many geographic observations. In Math the 5th and 6th graders have cruised through our unit on Statistics, Data, and Graphs and are now beginning a very exciting unit on Integers (yes this is Algebra, and yes, I am the only one actually excited about this unit!). Meanwhile the 4th graders will continue to develop their skills in Division. For Reading we are beginning our February Book Report on a Nonfiction selection which will be due at the end of this month. And In Writing we are entering what I call "Essay Contest Season" where students will use their best writing skills while they enter into several essay contests. The first contest we will enter is from the Center for Mission, which serves the entire Arch Diocese, and the prompt is "How do you share your gifts of the Holy Spirit with your community and how does this help you live out Christ's mission?"

And in Science, after all their hard work in preparation for our OLP Science Fair, all the 4th, 5th, and 6th graders are submitting their Science Experiments into the Catholic STEM Fair sponsored by CSCOE. This is a huge opportunity for our students and school, and we will be notified in early March if any students from OLP are selected to participate.

Mrs. Gleason Music

Our students did a fantastic job during our Catholic Schools Week Talent Show! I am very proud of the work and dedication they put into their rehearsals. Teamwork was the main theme of the group performances. Each member was important and we all relied on each other. Thanks to all who attended!

Ms. Cates Interventionist

I love working with all the OLP friends. Catholic Schools Week was a blast. My favorite activity took place on Monday when we visited Kingsway and played games, colored, and visited with the residents. It was such a special time for all involved. This week I read books about love and friendship to my preschool friends and made Valentine's Day themed projects. My first friends are working on reading and spelling long VCe spelling and words with the nasal sound /am/ and /an. My fourth graders spelling focus was controlled-r spelling. Their reading comprehension skill was identifying the main idea vs. supporting details. My fifth graders' reading comprehension skill was compare and contrast. Finally, my sixth graders' reading comprehension skill was analyzing informational text.

WINTER WEATHER CHURCH POLICY

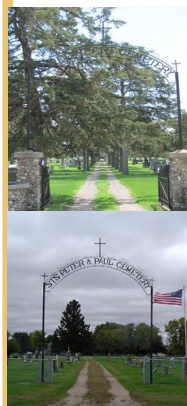
For the safety of our parishioners, remember our winter weather policy as follows:

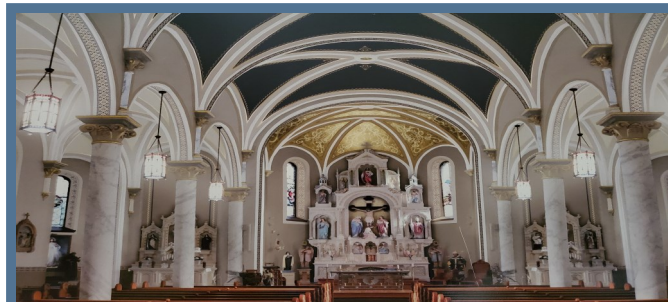

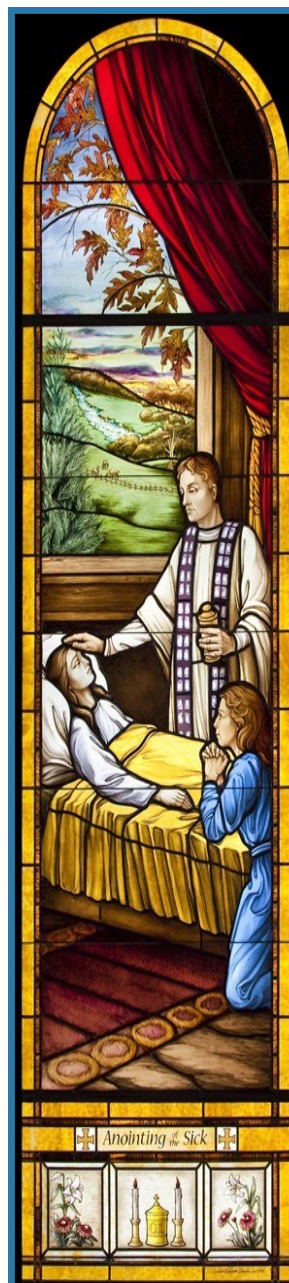
