Cemetery Price Increase Effective July 1, 2023

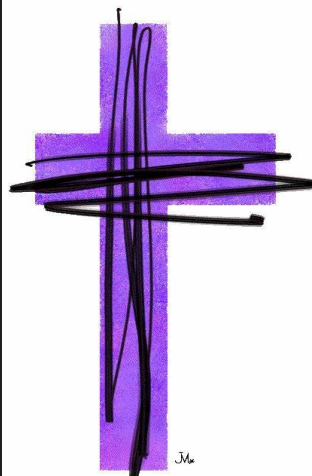
All cemetery lots purchased after June 30, 2023, will have an additional charge of \$200.00 (per lot) for perpetual care.

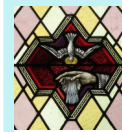

A Word from Father . . .

Lent

The holy season of Lent has its own unique history. The penitential season of Six Sundays and forty weekdays is preparation for the high feast of Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening. Therefore, the Sundays of Lent do not count in the calculation of the 40 days remembering that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert preparing for his public ministry.

Historically, Lent was the retreat-like final preparation period for catechumens, those being initiated into the Church at the Easter vigil. It was also known as a renewal period for the already baptized faithful to be inspired by the conversion of the catechumens. It was considered the rightful time of penance for the order of penitents (those serious sinners wanting to be reconciled with the church). The whole church came to adopt the season as time of penance as preparation for the joy of Easter. When we empty ourselves of all that keeps us from God, it makes room for allowing divine assistance to grow closer to God.

Let's embrace this time to renew our faith and embrace the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to help us in our spiritual preparation to be ready to celebrate the high feast of Easter!

Here's what's happening in the classrooms . . .

Mrs. Olson (Teacher Ashley) Preschool

Preschoolers are learning about ourselves and how to stay healthy. Valentine's Day we listened to an actual heartbeat and tried to match the rhythm with sticks. Then we tried different exercises to get our heart rates up. "I can feel my heart beat!"

We have added a pediatric clinic as a new dramatic play area. The babies are being seen for well checks. A few books we are reading in our classroom are: "Germs are not for sharing", "Llama Llama Home with Momma", and "5 Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed". I can't wait to share with our families how much each child has grown this school year at conferences next week!

Miss Schroers Kindergarten & 1st Grade

These past few weeks, our class has had two big events to celebrate together: Saint Valentine's Day and the 100th day of school! Saint Valentine is one of our February saints of the month and we have been learning about him as a class and school. We also made Valentines to share with others, decorated cookies and exchanged Valentine treats and cards.

Every morning, we count the number of days we have been at school and last week we made it to 100! This was an exciting event in our classroom and something we have been looking forward to for some time. Students participated in a number of one hundred themed activities including counting one hundred snack items to make trail mix, writing one hundred words and numbers, and painting and identifying the number one hundred. Students could even dress up as if they were 100 to mark this special occasion!

In religion, we have been reading about Mary and her "yes" to God! In Catechesis we learned about the Parable of the Yeast, the preparation of the cruets and chalice, and the gesture of the Epiclesis that we see at Mass. God Bless, Ms. Schroers.



Mrs. Hennen 2nd & 3rd Grades



We are working on homophones, y sounds like long e at the end of a two syllable word, and will start suffixes -ly, ty, - and y on Friday. In Language arts we are working on irregular verbs, pronoun/noun-verb agreement. 3rd grade math is about reading and making graphs! 2nd grade math is about subtraction with regrouping!

Our Social Studies chapter is about Building Communities: Growth and Change, and the Civil War.

In Science we have been doing a few Mystery Doug STEM projects: grouping animals this week.

Religion class has us learning about Pray for Healing and Eternal Life. We also learn about a saint each week. This week St. Jude.

Ms. Katie Cates (Interventionalist)

First grade friends are working on reading and spelling r-controlled vowels. These are words where the "r" changes the vowel to a different sound. Fun fact, we learned at er, ir, ur all say the /er/ sound. Those can be quite tricky to spell. My fourth graders spelling focus was pluralizing nouns and spelling words with the /aw/ sound. Just like our first grade friends, fourth graders found out that there are many ways to spell the /aw/ sound. Their reading comprehension skill was identifying the main idea vs. supporting details. My fifth graders' reading comprehension skill was identifying the story structure and inferring and predicting the text. Finally, my sixth graders' reading comprehension skill was distinguishing between fact and opinion.

Mr. Lopahs 4th, 5th & 6th Grades

The 4th, 5th, and 6th graders are going on an adventure! In Social Studies we are moving on from North America to South America, and with every new country we explore we add an entry to our Passport! In Math the 5th and 6th graders are knee-deep in Algebra learning all about Integers and Rational Numbers, and the 4th graders are continuing to solidify their multiplication and division skills. Readers are wrapping up their Non-Fiction book for their next book report, and Writers are submitting their essay contest entries. And in Science we will be continuing our STEM focus by building Toothpick Bridges.
