Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Today begins Holy Week and we solemnly enter into the holiest days of the year as Lent comes to a close and the Pascal Triduum begins with Holy Thursday. The royal entry into Jerusalem ends with the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. Saint Matthew offers many details of the passion account and the extent of Jesus' obedience to the will of the Father for our salvation.

Jesus' arrival as a gentle king is repeated throughout the readings. His reign is all about service. As king he desires to serve the will of the Father and seek the benefit of humanity. He refuses to seek vengeance on those who want to harm him. Jesus completely empties himself and submits to a cruel and painful death. This salvific suffering merits great reward and demonstrates the complete triumph of goodness over evil. Sin is no longer a threat to humanity and while the situation is bleak, the story has not yet come to an end.

I look forward to seeing you at Holy Week liturgies. We make extra time during Holy Week to be present for worship and take part in the sacred rituals of our faith. These are the high holidays and most important Masses of our faith. Please join us for Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday at 6:30 p.m. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will continue until 9 p.m. The Good Friday Liturgy will be offered at 6:30 p.m. Stations of the Cross will also be prayed earlier at 3 p.m. Our Easter Vigil will be celebrated at 8 p.m. Easter Sunday Masses are at 8 a.m. and 10 a.m.

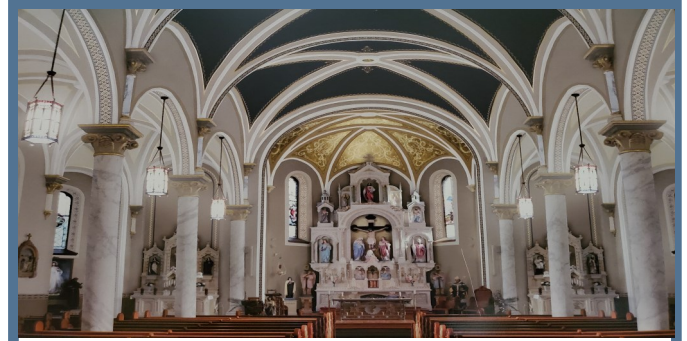

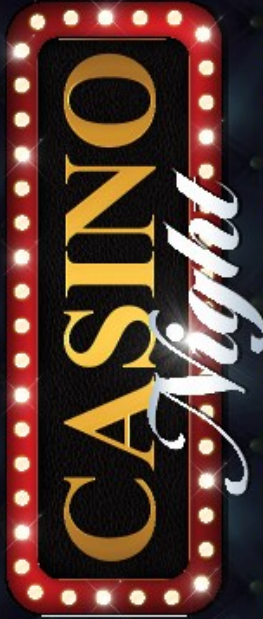

A Word from Father . . .

Next week we celebrate Holy Week. The events of Holy Week are much more than just recalling Christ's suffering and glorification. We actually celebrate his life and share in his victory. Through his Passion, Death and Resurrection, Jesus accomplishes the mission to which his Father calls him. He conquers sin and restores humanity to the justice of God. This is the holiest week of the year and these liturgies are the center of the entire Christian year!

Holy Thursday marks the end of the Lenten season and we begin to celebrate the Triduum (Latin for "three days"). On Holy Thursday we experience Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist, which has been handed down to us. At the celebration of the Lord's Supper, Jesus gives us an image of what the church is supposed to be like. We contemplate Christ in the Upper Room, on the eve of his Passion, as he made a gift of himself to the Church, instituted the ministerial priesthood and left to his disciples the new commandment of love. In this way he wished to remain with us in the sacrament of the Eucharist, making himself the food of our salvation.

On Good Friday we recall the brutal passion of Jesus who suffered so much for our sins and freely gave himself so to open the gates of heaven and prepare an eternal dwelling for all of God's people. Passing over through death to new life defines daily Christian living. We are called to take up our own cross in order to follow Jesus. Life offers so many opportunities to unite ourselves to the cross of Jesus. We venerate the cross to remember that it was our sins that put Jesus on the cross.

The Easter vigil is the grandest liturgy of the entire year celebrating the gift of newness of life. Fire is blessed to illuminate our passage from death into life as the readings are read. Water is blessed to signify our new birth in Christ. New members are welcomed into the church and the initiation sacraments are celebrated. It is truly a wonderful gift to all who participate! Easter Sunday is the day of resurrection and each Sunday we are reminded of Jesus overcoming sin and death and that his resurrection affords hope for each one of us!

I look forward to seeing all of you at our Holy Week Liturgies.

Ms. Katie Cates Preschool

It's been a fun week in preschool. For the past few months, I've been working every afternoon in the preschool building. When the students came back from spring break, I stepped in as their full time teacher. It's been fun learning the morning routines and getting to know our half day friends more. This week our theme was transportation. We learned all about airplanes, emergency vehicles, trains, boats, and hot air balloons. Next week, we are looking forward to learning more about Holy Week and why Easter is so special!

Mrs. Schroers K-1st Grades

After our week away for Spring Break, it has been so nice to be back with these students! They are ready and excited to be back learning together again. In our math, the kindergarteners are working on subtracting and taking apart numbers. The first graders are working on reading and making tally charts and picture graphs. In our Believe and Read, the focus for kindergarten has been targeting beginning and ending sounds, and short vowel sounds. We've been learning new sight words each week too. In first grade, the focus has been marking syllables and suffixes, and new sight words as well. Both grades have been practicing new stories in their readers and sight words books. In Catechesis, two of our newest words are the Parable of the Found Sheep and Psalm 23: "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters." Such a beautiful Psalm to reflect on. God Bless, Ms. Schroers

Hello Parents,

Welcome back from Spring break! The kids seem refreshed and ready to move on in their learning! In second and third grade we are putting together a mobile for the Gala and it is keeping us very busy! In our Believe and Read program we are on to ee/ea vowel digraphs and more homophones. Language Arts is review of suffixes, special verb "be", and possessive nouns. Second grade is reviewing adverbs and oo digraphs.

Second grade Math is all about reading and making graphs. Third graders will start Understanding Area! I love the Geometry Units! We will keep on reviewing multiplication as well.

After our Social Studies Test on Wednesday we will be learning about Becoming a Citizen.

As for Science we are still working on the Ecosystem. We have a few STEM activities we will try out to help understand what happens to organisms that don't get the resources they need.

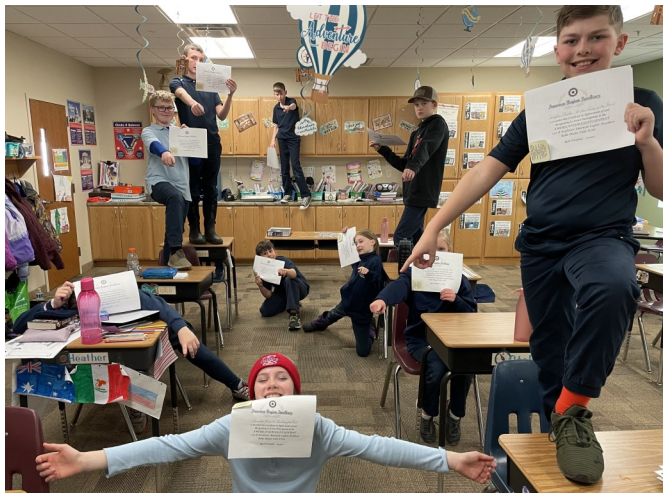
Mrs. Hennen
