Go and make disciples of all nations.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Our Lady of the Prairie,
How would you respond if Jesus appeared to you

moments to notice your inner reaction.



Would you be thrilled that Jesus had chosen and
entrusted you with his mission of "teaching all nations?" Or did you
find yourself coming up with a variety of reasons and excuses why
you are unable to "go and teach all nations?" It is easy to come up
with a wide variety of excuses about why we cannot "go forth and
teach all nations." We may say: "I have commitments, I am needed
at home, I have a job and my family needs the salary. I can't just
take off to go and "teach all nations."

And for most of us that is true. We do have responsibilities to our
families and our community. However, for most of us our call is to
preach the Gospel every day: by what we say, how we say it, what
we do and how we do it! The familiar adage: "Actions speak louder
than words" is very true! Every day we have the ability to "preach
the Gospel" without saying a word. We can "preach the Gospel"
simply by who we are, what we do and how we do it!

Words are simple and sometimes distracting. To preach how we
live is a full time commitment. The gift is: if we choose to preach

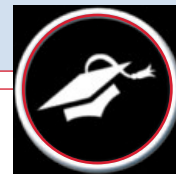

Re: Mission Appeal for Kabale Diocese-Uganda (June 3/4 2023)

Kabale Diocese Profile

Kabale Diocese is one of the 19 dioceses in Uganda located in the southwestern corner of the country—about 280 miles from the capital city of Kampala. We serve a population of about 1.8 million people, and 800, 000 are Roman Catholic. The vast majority of the people we serve are located in rural, underserved, and mostly remote areas of the country. Most critical among the challenges they face is healthcare. Leading causes of death in Uganda include neonatal disorders, HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, lower respiratory infections, diarrheal diseases, congenial defects, heart disease, stroke, road injury, and malnutrition.

Purpose of the appeal

The purpose of my request is to seek financial support toward the development of a hospital for the rural poor—Our Lady of Good Health Hospital Rushoroza. Through the gracious generosity of many, we have managed to complete the initial phase--outpatient department, minor operating room, medical/ surgical ward and small delivery/maternity unit. We are transitioning into the next phase for which we are seeking assistance, a phase that comprises of children's ward, dental, ophthalmology, radiology, medical laboratory units, and expansion on emergency room, operating room, maternity unit, and ambulance services. Our one and only ambulance is 16 years old and almost beyond repair.

We are also seeking assistance to support our long-term Kabale Diocese Orphaned and Vulnerable Children Program. Through our foster home care program, we provide out-reach support to orphaned children the vast majority of whom have lost both parents and are left all alone to fend for themselves. We provide them with shelter, school tuition, clothing, and healthcare. We are currently supporting 540 children out of well over 20,000 greatly in need of help.

Additionally, although we are eternally grateful for the gift of vocations, currently 78 major seminarians and 820 catechists, we face a mounting challenge of their training and formation costs--\$400/year for one seminarian, and 150 for one catechist in training.

Any measure of outreach help will be greatly appreciated.

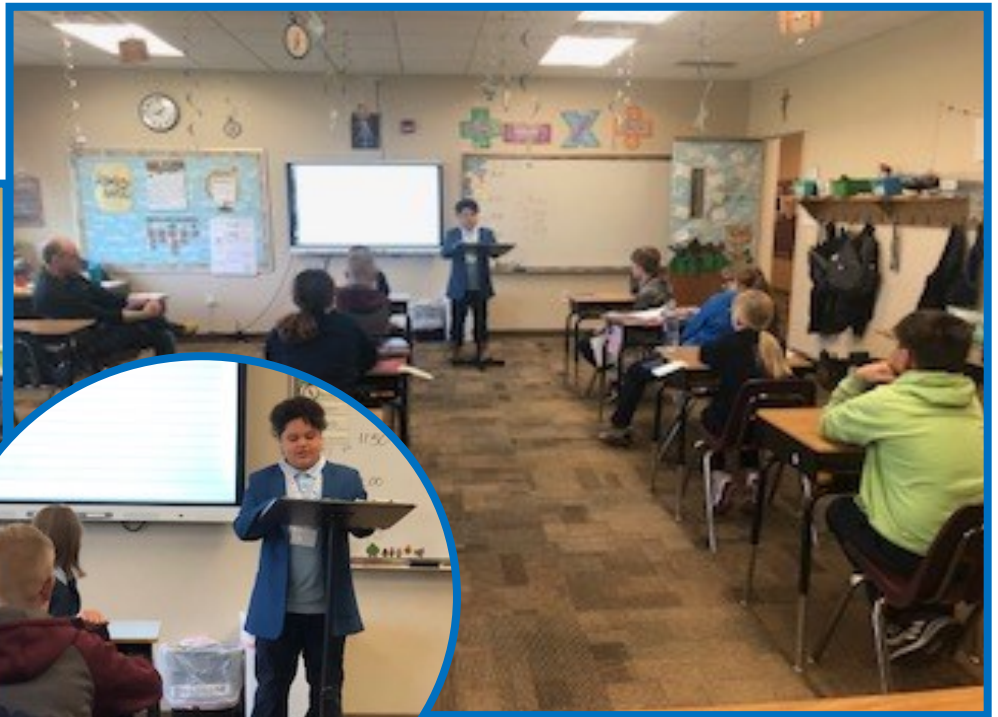
