

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." - Mt 22:37

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .

The readings this week call to mind what we are all about – loving God and neighbor. The two are connected and never opposed. By loving your neighbor, you cannot love God less, and by loving God, you cannot love your neighbor less. That is at the heart of God's ways and the core of our very being. Sometimes sin interferes and we are misled by the allure of evil, but Jesus never fails to remind



us to reset our ways and focus our lives on his teaching, preaching and actions.

The first reading from Exodus reminds us that God's revelation has always been about protecting the vulnerable and reaching out as God has chosen us for himself! Life is a precious gift and must always be nurtured and protected. Exploitation is always a grave matter. Neither the message nor the stories are new, but they must be retold so as not to forget and always remember. It also keeps us grounded in humbly walking with God.

The commandments are all about helping us to live in freedom as sons and daughters of God. They do not hinder or repress us, but liberate us to choose God's ways above all else. The commandments assist us to interact with God and each other. They always are the surest way to know that we are following the will of God, which is to make good, wise and prudent choices.

Do not forget that Wednesday, November 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation and we are obliged to attend Mass. Normally we do not offer a vigil Mass for this holy day because it is Halloween, but since we normally have a daily Mass at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, we are offering the vigil Mass option this year. Masses on Wednesday will be at 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. All Saints is an important holy day where we remember all of the saints that populate heaven, especially those saints not given a special day on the calendar.

The message of love and mercy never get old and we are called to share that message with all!



It has been a beautiful Fall season so far! We have been enjoying many Fall themed activities in our classroom. During apple week, we learned about Johnny Appleseed, the life cycle of an apple, performed apple experiments to see what would keep an apple from turning brown, and made homemade applesauce together. The theme of our math and reading centers have been fall related as well.

During fire safety week, we learned what we should do in emergencies and had our first fire drill. Students participated in the fire safety poster contest and we even had a few winners in our classroom!

Hello Families!

The first graders have been working on printing neatly and sentence writing. They are recognizing telling and asking sentences. First grade is also decoding words with the digraph blends sh,th, ch, wh, and ck. We are on our 3rd unit in reading. As for math class, the first grade is working on strategies for subtraction.

The second grade is working on cursive writing. We are also decoding words by using syllables. Second grade is recognizing prefixes and suffixes. We are also on the 3rd unit in reading. Our second grader is also in a book club reading chapter books and digging deeper into the story concepts such as opinion or fact. Second grade will start place value to 100 next week.

We finished Animal Biodiversity in Mystery Science and will start a plant unit. In our Social Studies we hope to wrap up unit one by the end of the month and start with the World Around Us.

Second grade is learning all about the Sacraments, and first grade about God's love and the two great commandments. In our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd class we've heard a lot about The History of the Kingdom of God. Stay tuned for next month's update! Mrs. Hennen
