

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .

Authentic Leadership is Serving God

In our day and age, power seems to lure and entice people. It seems to be a birthright of selfpromotion. The powerful receive privileges and have access to places and privileges hidden from all the rest. The workings of the world and honors bestowed by humans are quite foreign to the ways of God.



For the Christian, leadership has an entirely different meaning. It does not allow for personal pleasure and delight, but rather seeks to serve humbly. Jesus is our model and his example differs from leaders of his time as well as our own. Humility is really the opposite of power and the humble are really the ones that will allow us to have union with God.

Jesus is really trying to help us to understand that what really matters is how we understand ourselves in relation to God. We must acknowledge our created status before the status of the uncreated God. Yet it is God himself who allows us to be transformed into a new creation that allows us to be even more than creatures – sons and daughters of God. All of this privilege is due to the saving act of Jesus in the world. Jesus helps us to understand that we are defined not by our own accomplishments or power, but rather by how we are with God and with one another. It all comes back to humility.

Humility is a frequent Gospel theme and the hierarchy adopted by the Church. Our Holy Father is referred to by the title: "Servant of the Servants of God." Therefore, to exercise authentic leadership, we must be willing to humbly serve.
