



In honor of Saint Faustina, OLP PreK-6th student body assembled on the fourth Wednesday of October to sing the **Divine Mercy Chaplet.** One of our teachers said, "I thought Jesus was going to appear right outside the school windows while the children were singing." A parent walked into the school building and could hear the students singing the **Divine Mercy Chaplet,** he said that it brought him to tears; our souls are drawn to truth, beauty, and goodness. A new tradition has blossomed: the 4th Wednesday of the month, PreK-6th grade

The saint of the month in Mrs. Hennen's 1st and 2nd grade class goes to James Offerdahl. James is caring, obedient, and kind, and he stops to say hello to everyone. He notices when someone is sad, hurt, or needs help, and he forgives others when they budge in front of him. He forgives when others offend him and is always willing to ask others to participate in group work, or join him if they don't have a buddy. James shows mercy and forgiveness like St. Faustina teaches.

The saint of the month in Miss Schroer's kindergarten class is **Paisley Pekarna**. **Paisley** demonstrates the qualities of Saint Faustina by showing kindness and love toward others. She carries the love of Jesus with her and has a forgiving heart. Prayer is important. She is quick to volunteer to lead prayer and usually has a special intention to add to daily prayers. She understands the importance of praying for people. An example of this was when a classmate was sad and having a hard day, **Paisley** went to find a quiet spot in the room, knelt down and said a prayer for her classmate.

The saint of the month in Mr. Lopahs' 4th, 5th, and 6th grade class who most showed the Mercy and forgiveness modeled by Saint Faustina is **Jaxson Palo** .St. Faustina didn't have it easy and yet learned about how God's Mercy should be shared with everyone, and **Jaxson** showed true forgiveness in moments of frustration and pain. We are SO thankful for our preschool students and their families. Learning & growing together each week is a blessing! Students learned about many types of animals exploring the Jungle with Jesus. The Kindergarteners have been working on identifying letters and sounds and writing them in their workbooks. They are recognizing sounds at the beginning and ending of words. In math, kindergarten is practicing writing, ordering, and counting numbers. Each morning we keep track of how many days we have been in school and use tens and ones to count those days. We just celebrated our 50th day of kindergarten! Our science unit is on weather and seasons. We are learning many different types of weather and observing and describing the weather. The graph in our classroom helps us keep track of the weather patterns we observe at school. Kindergarten is learning all about the liturgical year of the church and saints. 
