





Hello Families,

The month of December is always so busy with Advent and Christmas projects that it just flies by! Our religion classes have had the main focus of Advent and what it means to prepare for Christmas. Our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd classes help us prepare too! First grade is learning place value to 100 and then to 120. Second grade just finished adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers with regrouping and will start a short lesson on measurement.

In reading class the first grade is adding suffixes to base words. Second grade and first grade are learning about characters and their traits. Both groups are writing stories and illustrating them.

We continue to enjoy Mystery Science as we learn about seed dispersal and how seeds/plants survive. In Social Studies we are learning about land formations and reading a map.

The Kindergarteners are continuing to build on their letter names and sounds in Believe and Read. We are now building words on our pocket chart and blending the sounds to read the words. They are also being introduced to sight words and learning about sentences. In math, our unit is all about two-dimensional shapes. We are working on identifying shapes by their sides and corners. Kindergarten is also drawing and tracing shapes

and searching for shapes all around our classroom. One of our centers this month is the nativity scene. We have been reading books about the birth of Jesus and the students have enjoyed playing with the figures at this station. Our nativity set was crocheted by one of our OLP parishioners. It is so special to us. In Catechesis, we also have many Advent works. The Annunciation to Mary, the Nativity of the shepherds, the Visitation, and prophecies in Isaiah have been some of these works.
