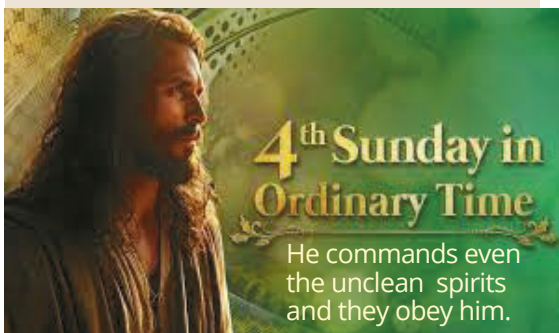

Here's what's happening in the classroom . . .

PreK

Our 2024 is off to a great start! As anticipated, students were anxious to see classmates and have settled back into our school routine.

Our first theme, Letter of the Week Qq, was student led with our students responding to the "Question?" What would you like to learn more about? It received the following responses: People & Animals, Weather, Grandmas, Driving, Dinosaurs, Construction and, How to build and make things? These ideas will be incorporated into future themes too!

Our Letter Rr Raindrops to Rainbow, a weather theme was colorful. Students made fluffy snowflakes, added rainbow colors to R, designed a crayon resist thunderstorm with watercolor paints and worked together on a cooperative art "Weather Quilt".

We will finish up the month exploring God's Galaxy with our Letter Ss- Solar System theme and we'll be on the move with a Letter Tt – Transportation theme.

We enjoyed the Bible Stories of Noah's Ark and learned about when Jesus calmed the storm.

Students entering Kindergarten in fall 2024 had the opportunity to spend the AM in the Kindergarten Classroom and took a ride on the school bus. SO MANY fun things planned for Catholic Schools Week including a Bowling Field Trip and Beach Party!

Kindergarten

It's officially winter and the start of a new year! Kindergarten is learning about winter weather and animals that live in colder climates including polar bears and penguins. We are reading many stories about the winter season and snow.

Our math unit is all about three-dimensional shapes. The students are working on identifying shapes by their features and comparing two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes. We've been searching for these new shapes around our school. Students also made patterns with shapes that stretched across the classroom.

In Believe and Read, the kindergarteners are learning new consonant and short vowel sounds. The students have been reading and spelling cvc words in their workbooks. They are also learning new sight words and reading them in sentences and books.

In Catechesis, we will begin the new year with parables about the Kingdom of God.

1st & 2nd Grades

Hello Families, we have been studying the order and patterns of numbers in both second and first grade!

In second grade religion we are learning about the Sacrament of Penance. In first grade, we have been learning that the Holy Spirit can help the church grow. We learned that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

First grade is working on recognizing if a word has a short vowel sound or a long vowel sound. We are also adding suffixes to words and finding out the spelling rules.

Second grade is working on r-controlled vowels and syllable division. We will wrap up our Chapter II Social Studies and begin a chapter on Using Our Resources.

For Science we are all about the Scientific Method and gearing up for our Science Fair during Catholic Schools Week. Students will go from brainstorming ideas to creating their own Science Project to show off their skills!

And in addition to the Winter MAP testing, students are working hard on their January Book Report.
