A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .



The Second Sunday of Lent always provides for us the story of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. In the presence of his closest disciples, Jesus reveals his divinity as the culmination of reaching the peak of the mountain. The Father speaks "Listen to my Son." Especially during the holy season of Lent we should be ever mindful to listen to Jesus speaking to us. Jesus wants to lead, guide and direct us so that we too may have a glimpse of the beauty of his divinity.

In our prayer we should talk to God, but also make time to listen to what Jesus might be saying to us. Spending time adoring Jesus in adoration is a good opportunity to distance ourselves from the distractions of life and allow the voice of Jesus to penetrate our whole being. We might be afraid of what Jesus has to say – stay near and close, follow in my ways – but these messages only help us to grow in holiness. Never fear taking time to pray and making sure that God also gets the opportunity to speak.

The first reading from Genesis recalls a truly remarkable story. Abraham is a great example of one who shows complete trust and obedience in God, even if that would mean sacrificing his beloved son, whom he waited so long to parent. Yet ever mindful that God knows best, Abraham believes the promises of God. He is indeed our father in the faith and we are grateful to honor his memory and be called heirs to the promises fulfilled through him. May we always desire to imitate the obedience of Abraham in responding to God's generous invitation to be a committed follower!

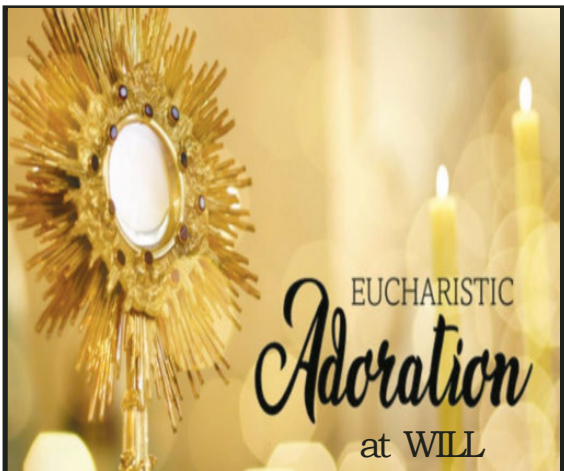

A Word from Father Michael . . .

Lent

The holy season of Lent has its own unique history. The penitential season of Six Sundays and forty weekdays is preparation for the high feast of Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the beginning of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening. Therefore, the Sundays of Lent do not count in the calculation of the 40 days remembering that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert preparing for his public ministry.

Historically, Lent was the retreat-like final preparation period for catechumens, those being initiated into the Church at the Easter vigil. It was also known as a renewal period for the already baptized faithful to be inspired by the conversion of the catechumens. It was considered the rightful time of penance for the order of penitents (those serious sinners wanting to be reconciled with the church). The whole church came to adopt the season as time of penance as preparation for the joy of Easter. When we empty ourselves of all that keeps us from God, it makes room for allowing divine assistance to grow closer to God.

Let's embrace this time to renew our faith and embrace the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to help us in our spiritual preparation to be ready to celebrate the high feast of Easter!

We had a double Mass week attending Ash Wednesday Mass and our School Mass on Friday with our Big Kid Helpers. We had a fun Scavenger Hunt for Letter Xx theme – students are SO excited that we are almost through the entire alphabet. This week was focused on Dental Health (X-rays), The instrument Xylophone, Fox wearing Sox and X-Ray Fish. We created a treasure map, added bones to an X and mixed yellow & red paint to create a fox. We will finish the month with a "Yummy, Yummy" Baking theme.

School is so fun! In first and second grade we have been writing and drawing book reports, art inspired by Piet Mondrian, lenten tracking and lenten 2 minute video clips

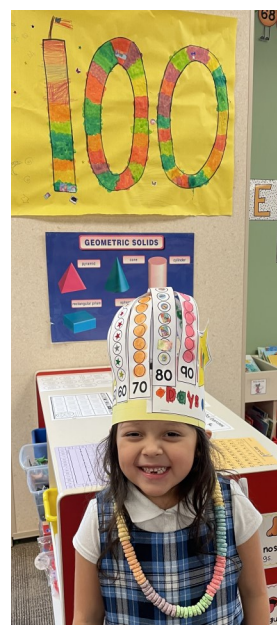
by Formed, and continue to grow in all subjects! In our Believe and Read language arts classes we are dividing syllables and discovering suffixes.

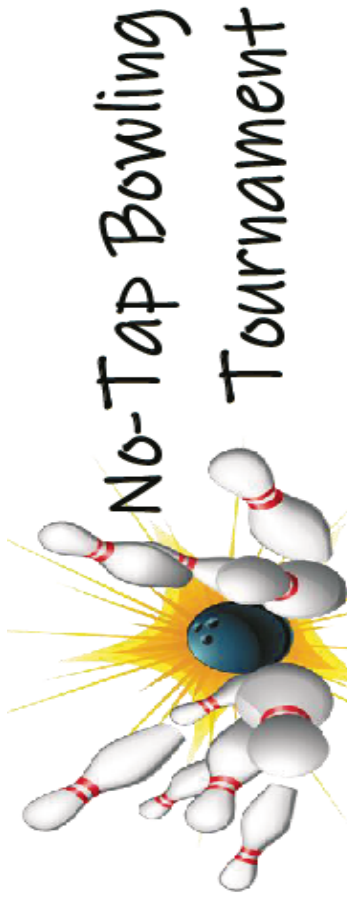

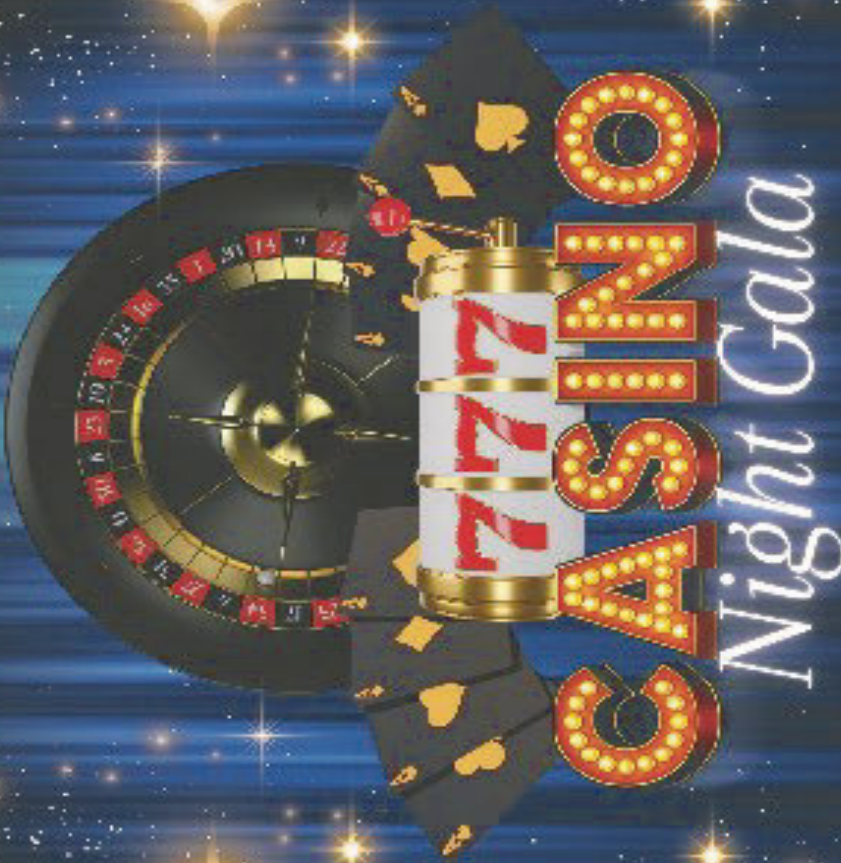


