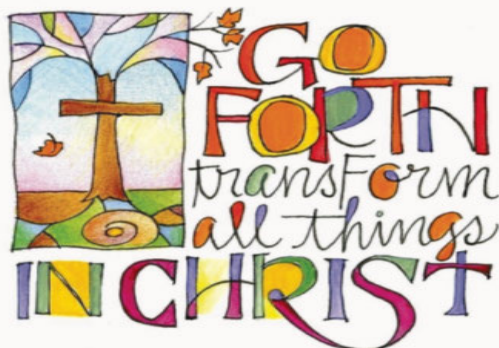

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .

The Greatest Mystery – The Most Holy Trinity

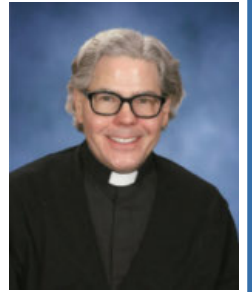
At the heart of our faith is the belief in the Most Holy Trinity – one God in three divine persons and three divine persons in one God. It is a mystery that we will never fully understand here on earth, but we recognize that unity of one God in three distinct persons. God lives as a community and shares his own life and calls us to communion. That's the gift of God that we are invited to share.

The conclusion of Saint Matthew's Gospel has Jesus giving the command to go and make disciples of all nations through baptism. Jesus specifically gives the Trinitarian formula to baptize in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. This weekend we celebrate the great mystery of the Trinity. By the grace given to us in the sacrament of Baptism, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit dwell in our souls and invite us to participate in their Trinitarian life.

As followers of Christ, we take to heart the command to go and evangelize with the mission to live in God's love and follow God's ways. We convert those we encounter when we live authentic lives rooted in the Gospel. We preach more with our actions than our words and in all ages and times, we must remain faithful to our baptism as members of God's family. God's life is a gift to us and God extends the invitation to be like God and make our lives a gift in return. May we allow the love of God to permeate our lives so that the love of God will be made manifest in our lives by being a gift to one another.

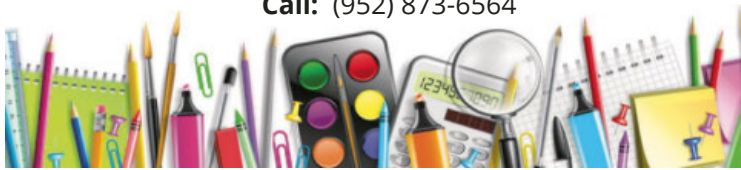

Silent Retreat

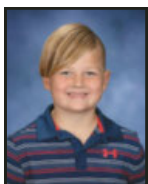
