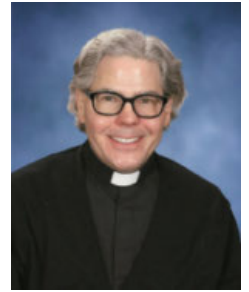
## A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .

We often experience the difficulties and hardships of life, but when we contemplate the goodness of God, we recognize the blessings. God always showers us with gifts and the greatest gift is forgiveness of our sins. We know that we live in a broken world – broken because of sin. We are the perpetrators and victims of sin. Only through forgiveness is our relationship with God fully restored. Saint Paul writes about our new creation in what Jesus has done for us in the second reading.

Life holds many storms and the scriptures this weekend introduce us to the power of nature. The first reading from the book of Job demonstrates that God has control over the great forces of nature. God's love and wisdom are always operating and we do not completely understand God's ways. Yet our lives are called to conform to God's ways.
