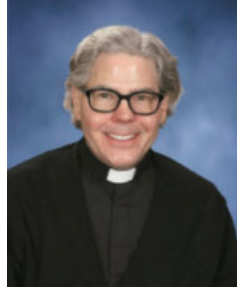

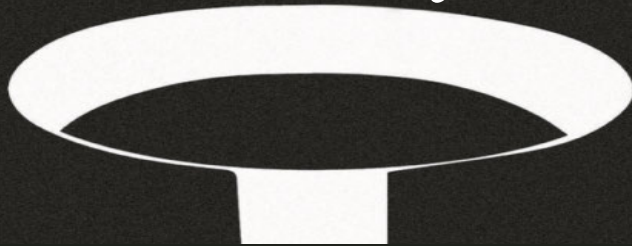

Kindergarten

Welcome back to school everyone! We have had a great first few weeks in kindergarten. Students have been trying lots of new activities and routines, as well as getting to know new friends. We have been practicing being good friends and helping while at school. How can we show kindness and love like Jesus loves us? In our Believe and Read program, the kindergarteners begin the year by practicing pre-writing skills including proper writing posture and pencil grip, as well as letter sounds and names. In math the focus has been on sorting things into groups by size, shape, and color. We were also excited to begin Catechesis of the Good Shepherd in our new Atrium space this year! It's going to be a great year of fun and learning! God Bless, Ms. Schroers



1st/2nd/3rd Grades

Welcome back to school families! The past few weeks we have been getting back into routine and reviewing rules we follow in our classroom. It is so nice to see the kids enjoy each other's friendship. In Math first, second and third have reviewed strategies for adding. In Science we are studying traits of birds. We used bent straws as beaks to pick up food (noodles) and a cup and discussed what worked best. In Social class we are learning about being part of a community and why we need rules and laws. First grade believe and read are reviewing letter sounds and tapping out one syllable words. Second grade has reviewed why a one syllable word with one vowel makes a short vowel sound. Third grade is reviewing syllables and short and long vowel sounds. Our Religion classes are focused on Jesus is God's Son and teaches us to love God and that God Loves Us. The stars have already completed tests in Spelling, Social Studies, Math, Science, Religion and Reading. We are gearing up for a hands on year of science activities. They did an outstanding job leading the Children's Mass and welcome Dr. Hendricks into the classroom weekly. During their time with their principal, they explore the weekly gospel with discussions on how to cultivate a deeper relationship with Jesus. We added, "Thankful Thursday", to our daily announcements and spend time in gratitude for all our gifts. These stars are not only excellent students, they are superb leaders in our school. If you see these stars out and about, please be sure to ask them what they are learning.



Phy Ed: September's focus: Basic skills and fitness. We completed a fitness test to set baseline marks for jumping jacks, sprints, sit-ups, push-ups and flexibility. We will test each quarter with a goal of improving in each area. While competition against others can be fun, fitness is really about being getting better and healthier!

Art: Ask your student about his/her drawing on our bulletin board outside of Roedel Hall featuring the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. In K-2, we will be learning about famous artists this year, starting with Pier Mondrian, who used straight lines and primary colors to explore composition. In the 3-6 class, we learned about what makes a good logo and will be designing a logo that can be used in a variety of ways. Mrs. Vandermark
