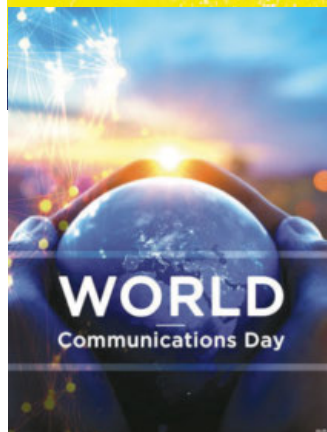
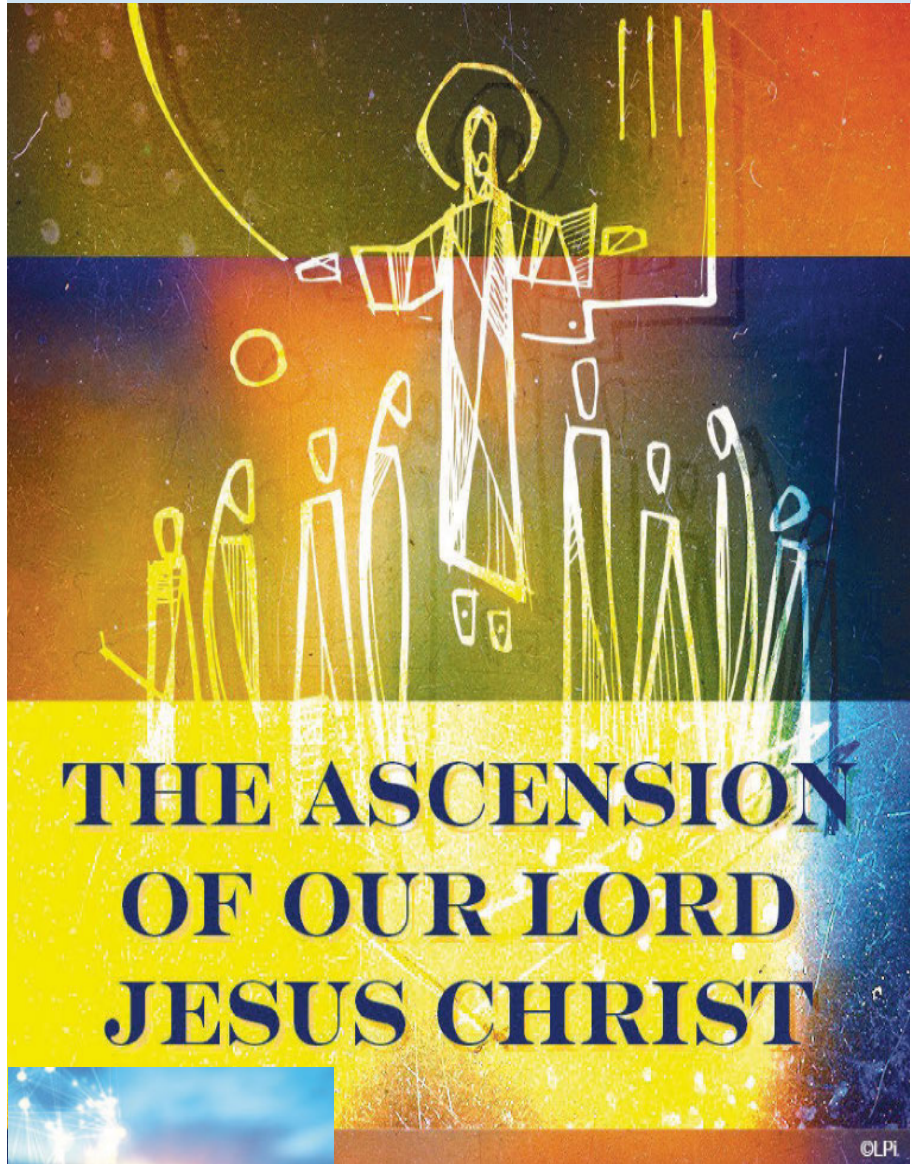

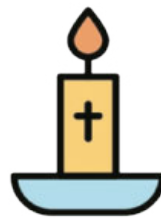

Here's what's happening in the classrooms . . .

Preschool

May was a BUSY and WONDERFUL time of our preschool year.

During our "Where the Ocean Meets the Sand" Ocean theme. We kicked off our week with a Beach Party for Cinco de Mayo. Students assembled colorful tissue paper donkey piñatas, shared fiesta themed items, wore flower lei's, heard "Pete the Cat at the Beach" by James Dean. We enjoyed a live performance from Climb Theater and took the big school bus to Minnesota's Largest Candy Store. Our "In the Tall, Tall Grass" Insect theme. Students painted a firefly and ant. STEM was focused on what insects look like, how they move and what they eat. Students learned new vocabulary related to insects. They enjoyed Insect Show & Tell" They used tongs to pick up butterflies and flowers in the water table, they had a game of Buggy Bingo and went on a Bug Hunt (movement activity). We celebrated ALL of the summer birthdays.

We had our last visit to the OLP Library that included an author visit. We used our strong muscles to walk to the Belle Plaine Library to learn about the Summer Reading Program. We also had our last music class and practiced a special song for Preschool Graduation. We finished the year with a **Preschool Graduation Ceremony** for (8) students that will go to kindergarten in the 2025-2026 School Year!

Kindergarten

We ended our kindergarten year strong with a joyful mix of learning and fun! In math, we explored measurement, practiced telling time to the hour, and learned about coins. Our Believe and Read time was focused on mastering short and long vowel sounds, as well as blending and segmenting words to build strong reading skills. In science, spring was in full bloom—both outside and in our classroom! We investigated questions like: *Are butterflies the only animals that start out as caterpillars? How do bees make honey? Why do bugs bite? and How do flowers bloom in the spring?* The students loved becoming little scientists and exploring the world around them. We also took a walking field trip to our local library, where we learned about how the library works and the exciting summer reading programs available. It was a great way to encourage a love of reading beyond the classroom! In Catechesis, we ended the year in the Atrium by learning about the beautiful sacrament of Baptism, God's great gift of His Risen Light, and the feast of Pentecost with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. These moments were deeply meaningful and a perfect close to our year of faith formation.

It has been a true blessing to be part of your child's learning journey this year. What a gift these students are!

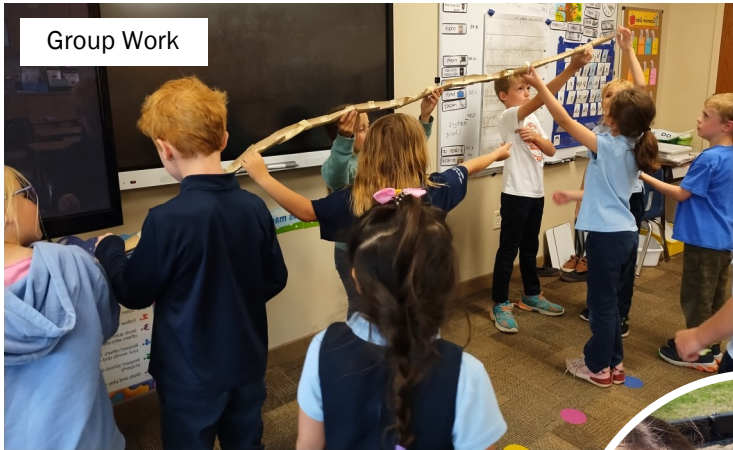
Our third grade student joined the fifth and sixth to read at the Lutheran Home.

While this school year is ending, we're already looking forward to what's ahead.

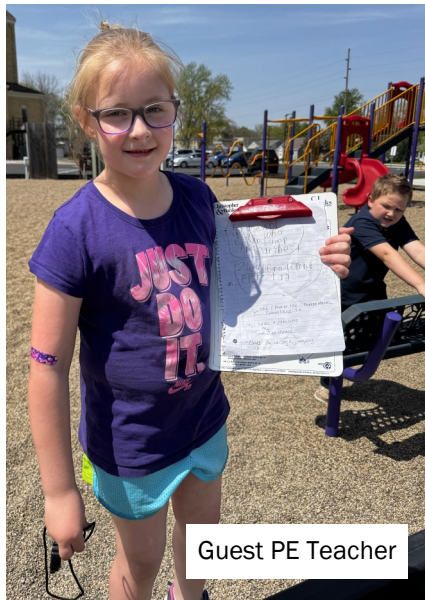

PhyEd: In May, we completed our Q4 Fitness Test, and I was excited to see how well everyone performed. Everyone was near or at their personal best in just about every area! We also had a guest PE teacher this month - Ms. Evie Simon! She did a fantastic job leading students in a variety of games from Sneaky Statues to Freeze Dance to "Simon Says!"

Art: Our final Famous Artist in our series this year for K-2 was Andy Warhol, an American artist who is well known for his Pop Art featuring items found in popular culture. Students learned about the screen-printing techniques he used to create colorful prints of familiar objects like Campbell's soup cans from his daily lunch and famous people like Marilyn Monroe. Then they created their own colorful prints with a familiar object - their hand!

The 3-6 grade class completed the writing of their Byzantine icons at the end of the school year; Father will bless the icons before they go home. This was a challenging project, as they not only learned how to do careful brush work, blend and layer color and shade to create depth and other advanced techniques, but they did it while studying ancient icons and writing visual Scripture. I am really proud of them and the beautiful work they did!
