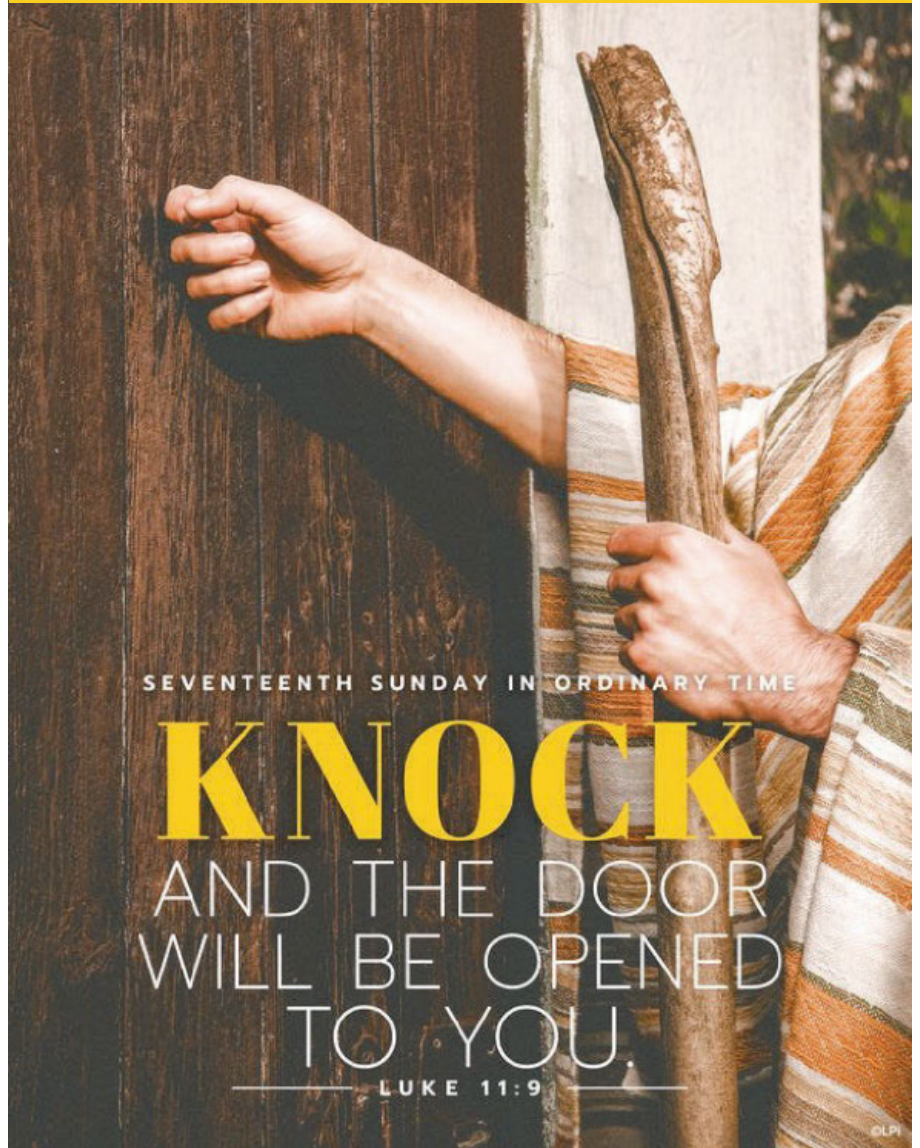

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .

This weekend the Gospel records a familiar prayer taught directly by Jesus, the Our Father! The Our Father is a classic and favorite, not only because it comes directly from the Lord, but because the pattern of the prayer teaches us how we are to recognize God and make our needs and requests known to the Lord. He also tells us a fair amount about prayer. Learning to pray takes persistence, but with anything good in life, the persistence pays off. 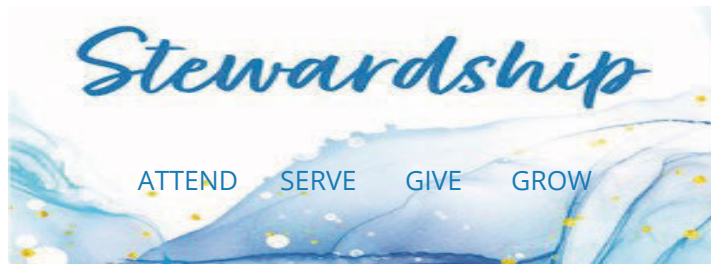

Annual Mission Appeal

Our Annual Mission Appeal will be next weekend, **Saturday August 2nd and Sunday August 3rd**. We will have a visiting Priest, **Fr. Terrence deSilva** from the Holy Trinity Parish, in the Diocese of Lexington, KY.


Fr. Terrence was born and brought up in Sri Lanka. He joined St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology, in Indiana, in 2011 for the formation of the priesthood. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 21, 2016.

It is the Mission Cooperative Program that will bring him to our parish, representing the Diocese of Lexington, KY. Fr. Terrence will be speaking on the needs of the Appalachian people of Eastern Kentucky.

About the Diocese

St. John Paul II established the Diocese of Lexington on March 2, 1988, erecting it from portions of the Archdiocese of Louisville and the Diocese of Covington.

The Diocese encompasses an area the size of Maryland, Delaware and Rhode Island combined, half of which is in the heart of Appalachia. Roman Catholics comprise 39,004 of the 1.5 million people in the area or 3% of the overall population, concentrated primarily in the larger cities and towns.

Of the 59 parishes in the Catholic diocese, roughly 40 rely on external funding to meet daily expenses. Twelve parishes are missions to other parishes in the region. The Catholic diocese offers the **Mission and Ministry Program**, providing over \$1 million annually for applicant parishes, schools and outreach ministries in the mountains. Our need is greater than this.

Overview of Our Mission Diocese



Mountain Ridges Outside Prestonsburg/Floyd County

The Catholic Diocese of Lexington serves the rolling hills of the urban and suburban areas of Central Kentucky as well as the mountainous and rural areas of Eastern Kentucky. The two regions are places of stark contrast and yet, they serve as places of opportunity for faith and evangelization as we live our Catholic social teachings in service to others.


In Eastern Kentucky, the natural beauty and richness of the land belie the grinding poverty that exists. Economic development is hampered by lack of business investment, low educational attainment and rampant addiction. Unemployment rates in Appalachia are 75% higher than the national average. Poverty afflicts over 25% of the population. McCreary County, Kentucky consistently ranks as one of the poorest counties in the United States.

The extraction industries, mining and logging – long the life blood of the region – are dwindling, along with their well-paying jobs. Minimum wage jobs are the norm and young people leave the area for greater opportunities. The income gap between Appalachia and the nation continues to grow.

While Catholics are low in number in Eastern Kentucky, the church is known as a source of comfort and support for all who are in need.

Holy Trinity Learning Center

The Holy Trinity Learning Center in Harlan County is an after-school math and language arts tutoring program designed to help struggling students and those who need an extra challenge.

The Church of the Good Shepherd

The Church of the Good Shepherd in Campton is a Catholic community in Eastern Kentucky distinguished by its outreach ministry. The Catholic reputation is strong here and the church is seen as the place to go. Good Shepherd operates the primary food pantry in Wolfe County, serving about 130 households every month. It also has a thrift store, open three days per week. They frequently receive requests for assistance that the Church can help with or connect them with another entity. **"People feel comfortable here and know we are here to serve them."** Kirsten Thorstad, parish life director, says of the largely non-Catholic nature of those who are served. While the church exists to evangelize, she notes that evangelization builds on human connection and relationships. **"For some people, you can't get to that point without taking care of their basic needs."**

St. Stephen Catholic Church

The St. Stephen Catholic Church has only 11 members in rural Harlan County, KY. However, the church's food pantry reaches 400 families per month and 200 seniors by providing robust boxes of food each month. This pantry is guided by Fr. Terrence de Silva and a devoted group of volunteers that hail from various area churches. This ecumenical outreach ensures that the many in and around Harlan County have healthy nourishment while going through financial difficulties.

Prison Ministry

Prison ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Lexington is a significant pastoral need, in part by necessity. There are five federal prisons, seven state prisons, two for-profit state prisons and 33 county jails spread across the diocese. And in addition to the priests saying Mass at different prisons on a regular basis, deacons and laypeople comprise this local witness to restorative justice.

The Father Beiting Appalachian Mission Center

The FBAMC in Lawrence County provides outreach services for the poor of Appalachia in the Eastern Kentucky area with a charitable and compassionate Christ-centered approach. Short and long term volunteer opportunities are available for periods of one week or one year, respectively.

Hispanic Ministry

Hispanic ministry is growing with the diocese's Hispanic population. The diocese offers 22 Spanish Sunday Masses in 20 cities. The Office of Hispanic Ministry collaborates with all diocesan offices in all matters related to the Hispanic community and strives to offer equivalent programs to be sensitive to the Hispanic culture, language and needs. It offers support and resources to diocesan offices not yet equipped to directly serve the Hispanic faithful and directed services to pastors and parishes to reach out, welcome and include Hispanics in the life of the parishes. The Office of Hispanic Ministry sponsors nine formation and evangelization programs and facilitates social and legal services.
