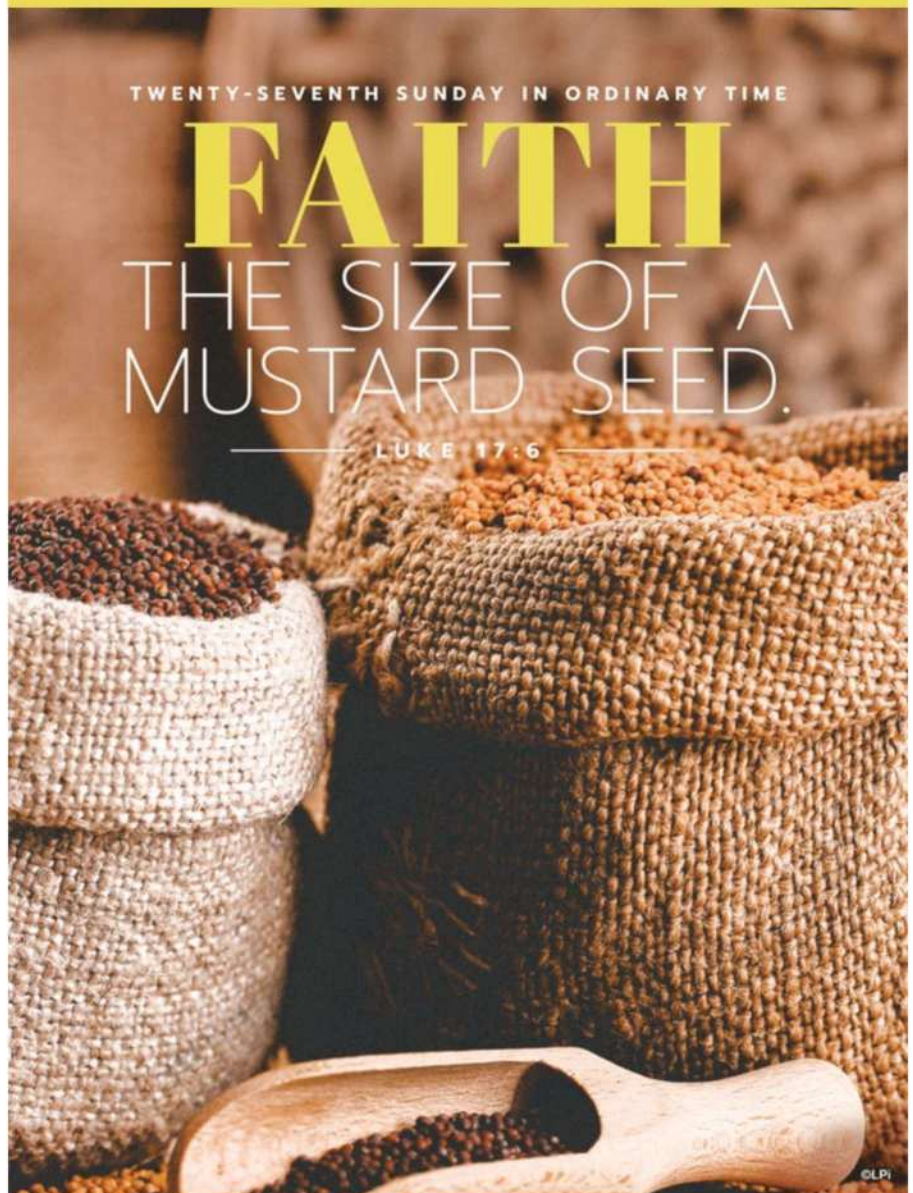

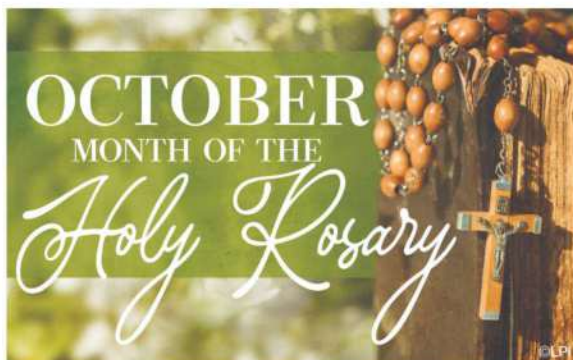

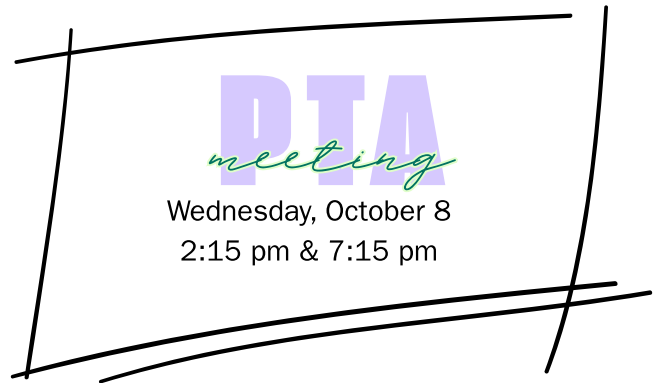

This week in P. E. we learned soccer skills, basketball skills, and played hockey. I found the children love to jump rope and are really good at it. My plan is to introduce different skills to their everyday lifestyle.



Welcome back to school - I'm excited to begin a new year in art!

In K-3, we are continuing our Famous Artists series with a whole new set of artists to study. The kids were excited when they recognized the work of our first artist, Vincent van Gogh, a Dutch Post-Impressionist painter known for his bold brush strokes and vibrant colors. Inspired by his *Starry Night*, our studio project involved creating swirling skies on foil and printing them on paper, then adding a city or natural skyline to complete the landscape.

Our 6th graders are continuing their study of Global Art as we learn about a variety of artforms from around the world and throughout history. Our first unit is a study of Navajo sand paintings and their use of symbols. Considered sacred to the Navajo, the paintings are created by medicine men as part of a religious ceremony to heal the sick and then destroyed. For our studio project, students selected a set of symbols to incorporate into their design, created drafts and then painted sand mixed with paint to their final design.

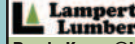
