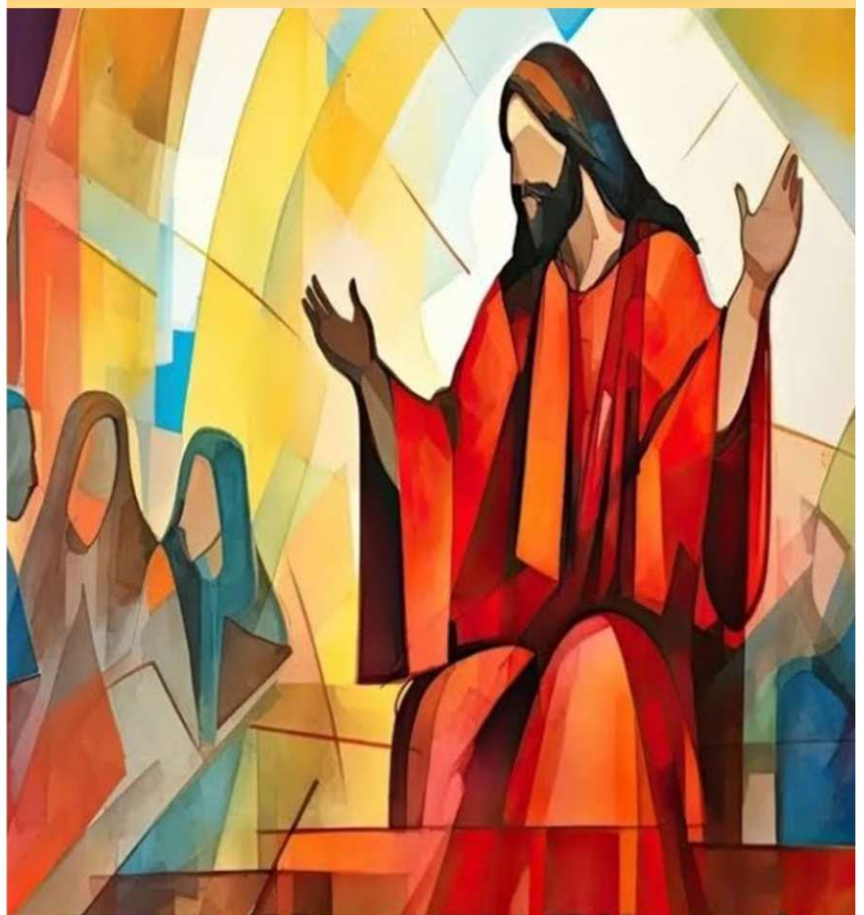

**MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .**

**The Beatitudes**

The Beatitudes are among the most well-known passages of the Gospel. We hear Matthew's account this weekend reminding us of how we are to live our Christian lives in order to achieve blessedness or happiness which is at the core of our very being. We live in a world which so often seems to reward the rich, the aggressive, the bold; those who seek to take advantage of others and care about no one except themselves. However, Jesus teaches the beatitudes to remind us about what is supposed to be important in our lives. Above all else, God is the primary focus of the Christian. All else pales in comparison and to live in this world according to the measure of the beatitudes is to truly live a counter-cultural life.



To depend upon God alone is at the core of the beatitudes. With God as the focus of our lives, we can truly acknowledge our own poverty and dependence upon God for the gift of life and blessings of our lives. To mourn means to recognize the vast expanse between ourselves and God. We are simply created creatures. God is infinite and only God can console us. As a prayerful people, we mourn before God and God comforts us in our complete dependence upon him. The meek recognize the greatness of God and live a life of humility giving thanks to God for their blessings and talents. To seek righteousness is to put our Christian values to work in the way that we choose to live our lives and the care and concern we show to others.

To achieve the Kingdom of Heaven, we are called to be peacemakers and stand up for what is right in the eyes of God, which often puts us in conflict with the politically correct society in which we live that permits abortion and our western culture is slipping into an acceptance of doctor-assisted suicide when life is no longer valued. The goodness of marriage between one man and one woman for a complementary spousal relationship and the rearing of children is under attack. When we face these difficulties in life, we can take refuge in our singleness of heart focused on God. The goodness and love of God is without limits; may we seek to imitate the life of Jesus so that we can share God's life for all of eternity. Then we will truly be blessed!

### Preschool

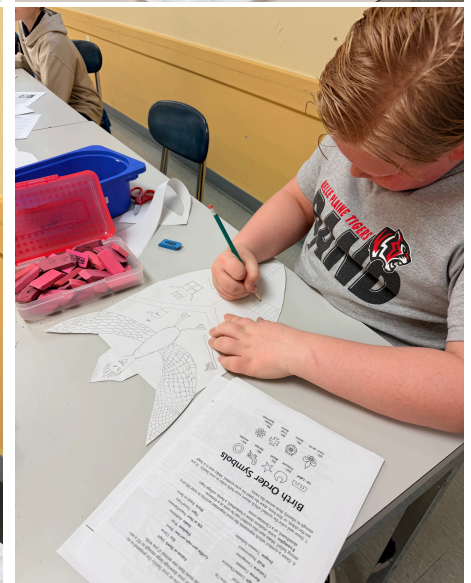


## Music
