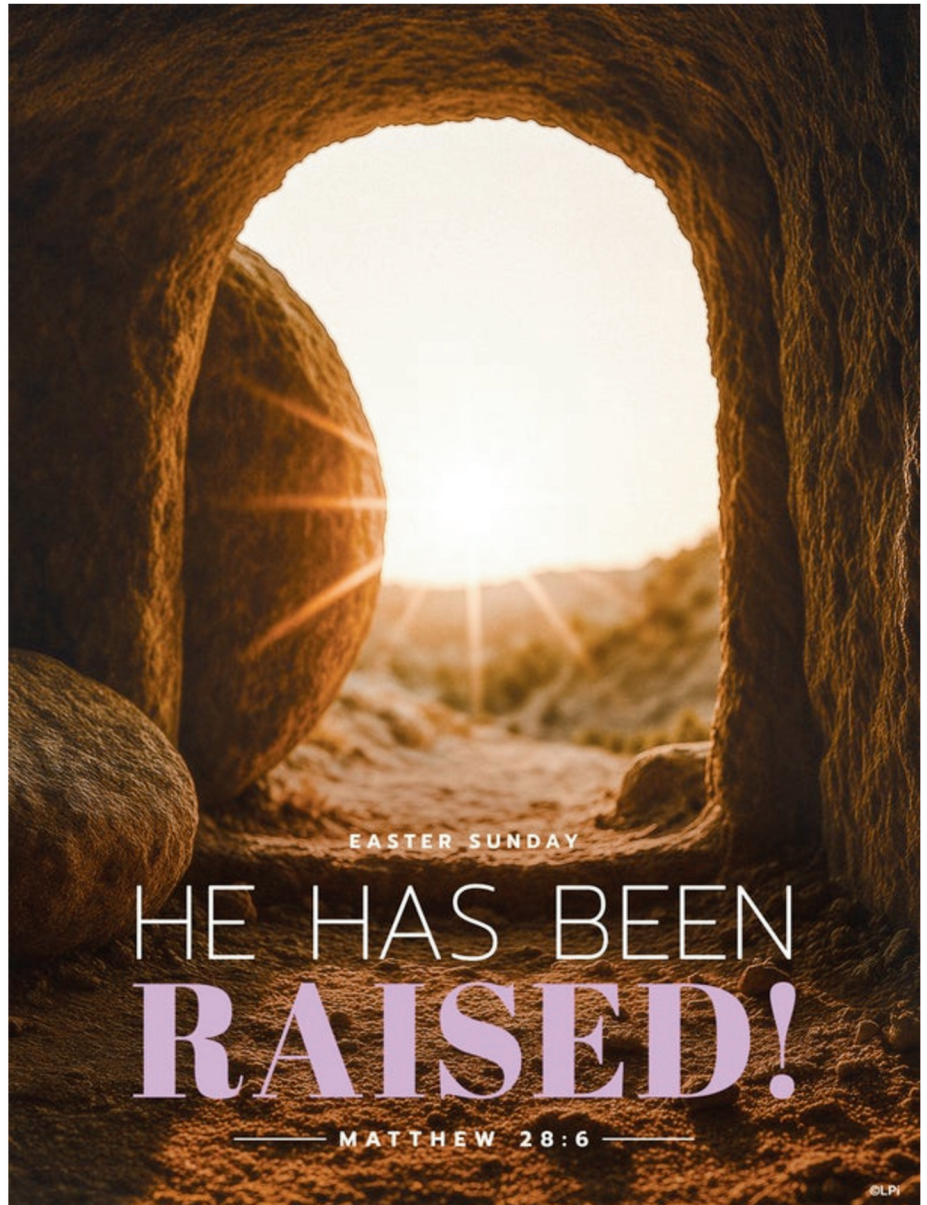

**MESSAGE FROM FATHER MICHAEL . . .**



The tomb is empty and Mary of Magdala runs to tell the apostles. Later, Jesus will tell her: "Go and find my brothers and tell them." He calls her by name to a new act of loving service, one that has given her the title Apostola Apostolorum, the Apostle of the Apostles. We too are called today and every day to go and find Christ's brothers and sisters and tell them - tell them of our encounter with the risen Christ. We must indeed tell them of the empty tomb. It matters that God so loved the world that he sent his only Son, it matters that he died on the Cross and was buried in that tomb two thousand years ago. And it matters that the same tomb which could not hold him was empty on the morning of the third day.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the core foundation of our Christian faith. Easter is the greatest of all celebrations that God always has the final word and speaks last. Sin and death are not obstacles for God's saving presence and that desire for our salvation gives us strength and comfort in our journey toward eternity. The Risen Christ is the source of our joy and hope. But the Risen Christ also challenges us to live our lives in response to our baptismal promises. That challenge offers us the opportunity to persevere in grace and willingly learn more about our faith; regularly practice our faith and evangelize with the example of our lives. May we confidently go into the world with shouts of alleluia that God is alive and present in our lives and help others to see God's presence in their lives as well. That is a message worth telling! 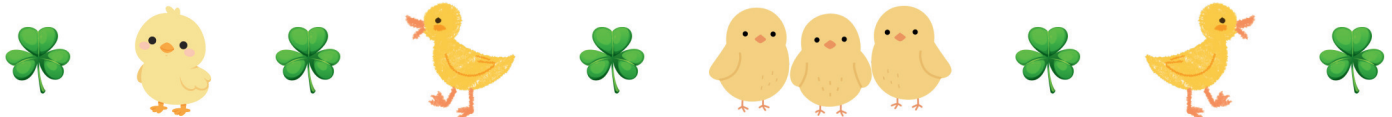

## A Word from Father . . .

The introduction of the Stations of the Cross in church is attributed to Saint Francis of Assisi (1181–1226). He is also credited with giving us the manger scene as a way of displaying the Nativity of our Lord in church. The 14 Stations of the Cross hang on the walls of every Catholic Church and it is a way for us to make a pilgrimage and follow the footsteps of Christ on Good Friday. Therefore, it has become a popular Friday devotion among Catholics and especially during the Lenten season we gather in Church to pray and remember Jesus' love for us as he endured a cruel passion and death.

Even if we have never been to the land of Israel, the Stations of the Cross place us in Jerusalem and allow us to at least mentally pilgrimage to the Holy Land and recall Jesus' final day on earth prior to his resurrection. While the events are tragic and sad, it helps our faith to know that God loves us enough to take on our sinful nature and redeem us with his own blood. That's proof of our preciousness in the sight of God. And it also helps us to remember that the difficulties of life will not triumph over God's promise of eternity in his sight. ## Here's what's happening in the classrooms . . .

### Preschool

Happy March!

This month we focused on our themes: Our five senses, animals in the zoo, St. Patrick's Day and Community Helpers. The students liked taste testing different fruits & vegetables, making zebra puppets and learning about Saint Patrick, creating a shamrock that represents the Holy Trinity. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Along with community helpers. They enjoyed a walk to the Belle Plaine Food Shelf. The students learned of different jobs in our community. ### Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we celebrated Dr. Seuss's birthday by reading many of his fun and silly stories. The students enjoyed practicing rhyming and noticing patterns in the stories. In science, we explored sunlight and warmth and students experimented with different materials-opaque, transparent, and reflective-to see how light can be reflected. In Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, we spent time reflecting on the beautiful parables of The Good Shepherd and The Found Sheep, along with Psalm 23. These lessons continue to help us grow in our understanding of God's love and care for each of us. In math, we have been working on addition. During Believe and Read, we are working on strengthening our skills in letter recognition, letter sounds, sight words, and sentence structure. Students are also working on reading and writing CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words. This is such a fun time of year in kindergarten to see how much the students have grown! ### **1st & 2nd Grades**

Hello Families,

As we draw near to the end of our Lenten season, we have been reflecting on our journey of preparing our hearts to allow Jesus to be the center of our lives. Our class has been spending a few moments each day to pray and remember the sacrifices we decided to make to grow deeper in our faith. Second Grade has been preparing for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion and the first grade is starting to learn more about the sacraments too.

We are all enjoying new concepts in Math, Science, Social Studies, and Reading. The warm weather has given us more opportunities to learn outside, move our bodies, and refocus our energy. We are taking quick walks to look at tree buds, pay attention to the weather, and notice any other signs of Spring.

Social Studies has us learning about the Declaration of Independence and The American Revolution which ties into our nation celebrating 250 years of Independence.

### **3rd Grade**

In March, the third grade students participated in a beautiful Lenten Service Project. Students wrote letters to a select number of Archdiocese Retired Priests. Students colored beautiful Lent Easter pictures that were included with their letters. Prior to sending letters, students prayed the Rosary 5 times during Lent in remembrance of the Retired Priest who will be receiving their letters.

Students participated in a writing/artist conference in Mankato, MN. Students enjoyed learning new writing techniques/skills as well as discovering new skills in art.

In reading, students learned about Benjamin Franklin and Public Libraries, Benjamin Franklin and the United States Postal Service, Amelia Earhart, Eleanor Roosevelt, Chinese Language and Culture, Metrology, and Microscopes.

In math, students studied fractions, and measurements. Students applied measurement skills in the classroom setting with enrichment activities.

In science, students learned about heredity, survival, and selection. Subtopics included traits, inheritance, natural and artificial selection, animal groups and survival, and environmental variation. Students had the opportunity to extend the content of the lesson through hands-on science activities and science games. Students attended C-STEM twice a month.

In social studies, students studied Amelia Earhart: Aviation Pioneer, Eleanor Roosevelt: "First Lady of the World", Chinese New Year, Chinese Language and Calligraphy. Students read Scholastic News articles twice a month.

In religion students planned and participated in school Mass, went to confession, attended Divine Mercy, and school Rosary prayer time. Students attended CGS weekly. Students prepared for Lent through study, and prayer. Students learned about Saint Patrick. Blessings, Mrs. Eischens



### 6th Grade

Mrs. Moonen's 6th grade stars have been busy learning and serving in many meaningful ways this month! We are proud to share that they finished 7th in their Math League division and an impressive 68th out of 102 teams nationally—an outstanding accomplishment that reflects their hard work and perseverance. Beyond the classroom, students enjoyed time at the Lutheran Home, where they built connections with residents while playing bags together. They also took a hands-on learning trip to the Ney Center, where they studied the impact of Emerald Ash Borers and helped cut down diseased trees, gaining a deeper appreciation for environmental stewardship. Our students further explored their creativity at the Young Writers and Artists Conference at Bethany Lutheran College, and they are currently diving into experiential learning by making pizza crust as they study fermentation. In language arts, they are engaging with the classic novel *Treasure Island*, sparking imagination and discussion. We are thankful for these opportunities that continue to shape both their minds and hearts!

### Art

K-3 studied "The Father of Modern Art," **Paul Cézanne**, a French Post-Impressionist painter. He loved to paint still lifes because he could take his time (the subjects don't move!), and often featured apples. Students explored **still life** with colorful scrapbook paper and construction paper fruit, adding shadows and highlights with soft pastels. 6th grade explored the history of Mosaics, which use tiny pieces of stone, etc to create a larger design. Students studied the first mosaics from Ancient Greece, as well as ones from Ancient Rome, the Byzantine empire, Morocco and modern works. Inspired by Roman designs, they planned their designs on a grid and then transferred small tiles to a frame.
