As summer vacation dawns upon us, don't forget to stay close to God and the church. Spread the word about the great offerings in our parish school. God bless you, Father Michael Kaluza

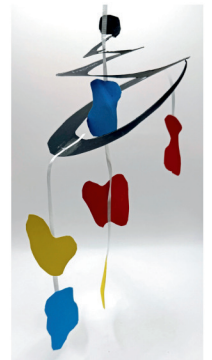
Here's what's happening in the classrooms . . .

ART

K-3: Our last famous artist of this school year is **Alexander Calder**, an American sculptor known as a pioneer of **kinetic art**. He invented the mobile, which delicately balanced abstract shapes on wires that moved in the air. Students were surprised to realize they likely had something inspired by his invention hanging over their cribs as babies. They created a mobile by cutting out organic shapes from card stock and hanging them from a spiral with curling ribbon.

6th: Our last Global project of the year brought us to Panama and the textile art of Molas made by their native people. Molas feature colorful animals, flora and geometric shapes made by intricate appliqué and embroidery. Students made a paper version by cutting out the shape of an animal in three sizes to replicate the layers of fabric and then added geometric details.

During Believe and Read, we focused on mastering short and long vowel sounds while strengthening our blending and segmenting skills. Spring came alive in science as we explored questions like: How do bees make honey? How do flowers bloom? and Are butterflies the only animals that begin as caterpillars? In Catechesis, we closed our year in the Atrium learning about the Holy Spirit and Pentecost. These moments were deeply meaningful and a beautiful way to end our year. We also enjoyed some fun end of the year events including: a walking field trip to our local library, a visit to the Yellow Candy Barn, the outdoor classroom, and a fun afternoon of field day events. 1st & 2nd Grades

Dear Families,

Welcome to the end of the year newsletter!

As we reach the end of the school year, our days have been bursting with May excitement! It's a busy time, but we've added a little extra fun to make these final weeks memorable for our students.

We have used the outdoor space to plant two kinds of flowers (marigolds and geraniums). We put each in the sun and each in the shade to see if one area is better for the plants than the other. We traced our shoe shadow and a street sign shadow and went out at different times of the day to see how the shadow changed in space and size. We have enjoyed Climb Theater, The Candy Store, and Rad Zoo, along with getting to the end of our reading, math, science, religion, and social units. Second graders have touched a little on arrays and division of shapes to introduce multiplication and division. First grade is reviewing adding and subtracting two-digit numbers. In our religion we have focused on honoring Mary during the month of May.

3rd Grade

In May, the third grade students attended the following field trips; Climb Theater, Science Presentation of DNA, Yellow Barn Candy Store, and RAD Zoo. Each field trip provided wonderful hands-on opportunities for students to learn about the content of the subject being explored.

Students spent time in the outdoor learning classroom working on the gardens. Students loved being outside creating a beautiful garden area for the school and OLP community to enjoy.

In reading, students learned about Donkeys, Libraries of the World, Osaka Japan, Japanese Food, History of the Western United States, Cattle Drives, Dine': the People, and Clean Water.

In math, students studied area and perimeter. Students practiced their math skills/knowledge in the classroom setting with enrichment activities.

In science, students learned about weather, climate, forces, motion and magnets . Subtopics included balanced and unbalanced forces, balanced forces and engineering, patterns of motion, gravity and friction, magnets and forces, as well as magnets and engineering. Students had the opportunity to extend the content of the lesson through hands-on science activities as well as science games. Students attended C-STEM twice a month.

In social studies, students studied the nation of Native Americans who live in the Southwestern United States, the country of Japan, and the history of Western United States. Students read Scholastic News articles twice a month.

In religion students planned and participated in school Mass, went to confession, attended Divine Mercy, and school Rosary prayer time. Students attended CGS weekly. Students learned Jesus' teachings about the Kingdom of God.

Students learned about God's Holy People; and completed a specific study of Saint Peter, Saint Mary Magdalen, Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, and Saint Francis. Blessings, Mrs. Eischens

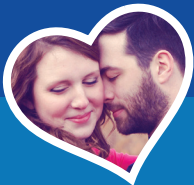
